What is the Project?

- A shared crisis plan on file with the Halton Regional Police Service
- A go-to document for police when individuals are in crisis



Why?

- To provide an individual response
- To provide a community response
- To reduce rates of criminalization, detention and hospitalization



The Protocol:

- A shared agreement between the agencies and the police
- Reviews the intents and purposes of the project: to better support individuals during a time of crisis



Consent Form:

- Consent is for sharing of the information only contained on the crisis plan with HRPS
- **Does not** give permission for ongoing dialogue between HRPS and the agency



- Expiry date of the consent is specified on the consent form
- Crisis plan is removed from HRPS system and destroyed when consent expires



Common Crisis Plan:

- Crisis plans will not be red flagged in HRPS system
- Communications Department will only have access to the crisis plans
- Crisis plans are only accessed once the call received has been determined to be a mental health crisis



- Responding Police will receive information contained on crisis plan when the call has been deemed a crisis
- Crisis plans will be securely destroyed by HRPS upon expiry or when otherwise directed
