Service Criteria (age, diagnosis)	- 16+ years (services at 18) - Developmental disability (significant limitations in cognitive and adaptive functioning); or no diagnosis, but seeking an assessment	- 16+ years - Developmental disability or dual diagnosis (developmental disability + mental health issues). Documentation of diagnosis is generally not required.	- 16+ years - Dual diagnosis (developmental disability: IQ 70 +/- 5 & mental health needs). Do not take clients with Borderline ID - History of unclear assessment and diagnosis

Wait Times	DSO can connect you to services and determine eligibility, but there may be wait times (e.g., psychological assessment for diagnostic purposes may be 3 mos). DSO does prioritize based on the urgency of the case.	If patient is in ED, will endeavor to send someone out to assess and consult, but this can take up to 3 days.	If inpatient in ED, can usually send someone out within 3 days for consultation. Within CAMH ED, response may be quicker.
Service Limitations	Cannot provide crisis response, but can refer to crisis services.	<b>Cannot</b> provide medical or mental health emergency services that require an <u>immediate</u> mobile crisis response.	Cannot provide crisis response but may be able to offer some assistance or direction over the phone during business hours.
